2. What is the difference between Educational Management and Educational Administration? Discuss briefly the major characteristics of decision-making in Educational Management.
3. Define professional ethics. Critically evaluate the role of professional ethics, values and conduct of teachers in shaping the personality of students.
4. What are the legal provisions as guaranteed by the Indian Constitution for promoting the education of persons with disabilities? How can teachers facilitate the learning of such children by their role and responsibilities?
5. What are the objectives of Institutional Planning in schools? Mention the advantages of good Institutional Planning.
6. Explain the concept of Computer-Assisted Instruction (CAI). Make a comparison of a human teacher and CAI with reference to educational activities.

7. What do you mean by software and hardware approaches in Educational Technology? Discuss and analyze how these approaches together strengthen the teaching-learning process in modern classrooms.
8. Explain the importance of Vocationalization of Education at the secondary stage. Evaluate how such programmes can enhance employability and productivity among learners.
9. What do you mean by Teaching Skills? Discuss the relevance of microteaching strategy in improving specific teaching skills among pre-service teachers.
10. Discuss the objectives of Operation Blackboard and its importance in the National Education System. How did it pave the way for subsequent reforms in the Universalization of Education?
11. "A teacher is not merely an instructor but a facilitator of learning who encourages children to construct knowledge." Discuss the role of a teacher in the constructivist approach of teaching in modern classroom with reference to NCF-2005.
12. What is the Multimedia approach in Education? How has Educational Technology changed the teaching, learning and evaluation processes in Modern Education?
